PASTORAL ADVISORY COMMITTEE  
MINUTES OF MEETING  
MARCH 11, 2014

The meeting was opened with a prayer by Deacon Bill Schofield. Members present were James O'Leary, Rita Selby, Patricia Rose, Roland Roy, Deacon Bill Schofield, Joseph Calise, Donna Bosworth, and Walter Richardson.

The minutes of the previous meeting were reviewed. Jim O'Leary made a motion to approve the minutes which was seconded by Roland Roy and unanimously approved.

1) MAY BREAKFAST

Father Lemlin announced that the new date for the May breakfast would be May 18<sup>th</sup>. Donna Bosworth reported to the committee that a meeting had been held on March 10<sup>th</sup> with about 15 people attending. All prior volunteers have been contacted to see if they can help. The breakfast will have the same hours and the same menu as in the past. The committee will be soliciting donations for food. The boy scouts have volunteered to help.

2) CHOIR

Roland Roy reported that there are about 14-15 members of the choir. For Easter Regina will bring in some extra help.

3) GRANDMA'S ATTIC

Rita Selby reported that 132 customers had been served since the previous meeting. There is also a new worker.

4) BAPTISM

Father Lemlin reported that a new request for Baptism had been sent in today.

5) FAITH FORMATION

Father Lemlin advised the committee that on April 6<sup>th</sup> four youths will be confirmed.

6) CAPITAL CAMPAIGN

Jim O'Leary reported that the funds are still coming in and that we are on schedule. Father Lemlin noted that there is about \$65,000 in pledges still outstanding.

7) FINANCES

Father Lemlin reported that we had had a couple of weeks with good collections.

#### 8) CATHOLIC CHARITY APPEAL

Father Lemlin reported that \$8000 had been collected this past weekend toward the goal of \$32,550.

#### 9) OFFICE OF PASTORAL PLANNING

The committee is in favor of attending the proposed workshop depending on the time and place.

#### 10) OTHER BUSINESS

Father Lemlin advised the committee that a realtor had inquired about purchasing the play ground for the site of a national discount store. He advised the realtor that none of the property of the parish was for sale.

Rita Selby inquired about painting new lines in the parking area. Father Lemlin responded that the project is in the works. Other future projects include: plumbing in the parish center, painting the exterior of the rectory, replacing the flooring in Grandma's Attic, and cleaning the parking lot from sand. Also the sign for the church will be worked on and then reset in concrete.

Rita Selby inquired about the painted arrows. Father Lemlin noted that the arrows are wearing out and would not be repainted.

Donna Bosworth noted that some of the flooring under the pew was coming up. Father Lemlin noted that he may ask the Finance Council to use some of the proceeds from the May Breakfast for that project.

Father Lemlin reported that there will not be a 6 p.m. Mass on Easter. The final 6 p.m. Mass prior to the summer break will be on April 26<sup>th</sup>.

The next meeting will be held on April 8<sup>th</sup> at 6:30 p.m.

There being no further business, Rita Selby made a motion to adjourn which was seconded by Donna Bosworth and unanimously approved.
