

Some random thoughts by the pastor...

'And who is my neighbor?'...'The one who treated him with mercy.' A neighbor – for many of us – is one who lives nearby. Jesus extends the definition of who is a neighbor when he tells his story about the Samaritan who compassionately cares for the needs of a Jewish stranger. The point of the story is: that which distinguishes and separates us are inconsequential. Jesus points to God who is in union with us. Since God is in union with each of us (and all of creation) we also are in union with each other. That which differentiates us from each other has value only when the differentiations also serve as means by which we can help each other. God is good.

Parish updates: The representatives from Saint Mary, Saints John & James, and CTK met as part of the regional meeting (June 29th). We reviewed the Vision Statement – prefaced with an explanation – and agreed to publish it in each parish's bulletin. (Since it is the summer months and numerous parishioners are away, we will publish the joint statement several times.) The joint statement reads: 'A Diocesan concern for the diminishing formation of priests has encouraged Bishop Tobin to recommend that in areas with a high density of parishes, pastoral committees of neighboring parishes should consider collaboration and consolidation options.

In the spirit of these concerns, three parishes, Christ the King, Saint Mary, and Saints John and James have tentatively agreed to begin exploring how cooperative initiatives may be of inclusive benefit to all three [parishes].

At the first meeting of [the] parishes' representatives on June 21, a mutually positive atmosphere was quickly established. An exceptional rapport was evident within the group as ideas and considerations were expressed. To a person all states this was the first meeting that left them with an exceptionally positive attitude for the future.

The one definitive decision all agreed on was to establish a preliminary Vision Statement that could be presented to all three parishes' parishioners. With that decision this brief initial statement follows. With time and thought, revision will be encouraged to provide us with guiding force to develop a comprehensive mission plan.'

Vision Statement: Our vision is to enable our parishes to be welcoming, mutually sustaining, open to growth, and committed to building one faith community honoring the uniqueness of each [parish].
