

Some random thoughts by the pastor...

Epiphany: God being revealed. When is the last time (that you can recall) that God was revealed to you? Our minds tend to think of moments of joy, a child's face, a sunset/sunrise. Yet, it is when the Magi are under duress - Matthew's Gospel tells us that God is revealed to them. It is when they are in a foreign land, lost, being manipulated by a political power, happening upon a family who are nobodies, that God is revealed to them ... and they – surprisingly are open to God being revealed to them! God is with us in our human messiness. Hopefully, we too discover ourselves being surprised by God being revealed to us when we least expect God. God is good.
