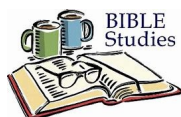

Some random thoughts

What allows Simeon and Anna to see beyond the child who is being presented by his parents? Recognizing beauty comes naturally to anyone who knows that they are loved and lives in this reality. The recognition of beauty is less apparent to anyone who doesn't know that they are loved and therefore do not live in this awareness. Proficiency, success, adulations, and justice replace warmth, compassion, mercy, and inclusiveness in any who live in unawareness. This is an observation and not a judgment. Luke's stories about the birth of Jesus are filled with people who are aware (and who see beauty) and people who are not aware (and who are blind to beauty). Seeing beauty is our recognition that the Divine is with us in every situation ... especially the ugliest. How easy is it for us to see beauty? God is good.

Parish Updates: Ash Wednesday happens on February 26th. We will celebrate two Masses: 9:00 am and 7:00 pm, during which ashes will be distributed. It might be an opportunity for us to practice listening to silence. There is no right way or wrong way to listen to silence, and the way in which we know that we are listening to silence (also known as contemplation) is that our way of relating with others (and ourselves) changes. We might not be aware of change initially, but as our practice persists, change catches our eyes. What also can catch our eyes are the less than loving way that we have been relating with others (in particular, our family members).
