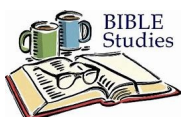

Some random thoughts

Jesus uses two examples in today's Gospel story from Matthew. The first concerns salt. He asks: 'But if salt loses its taste, with what can it be seasoned?' The obvious answer is: 'Nothing.' If salt loses its taste, it is no longer salt. The second example concerns light. By its nature, light can't be hidden or it stops being light. Though the examples are imperfect, they offer us an insight into who we are: created in the Divine image. We can't stop being created in the Divine image (just like salt can't stop being salt, and light being light). We can however, choose to deny that we are created in the Divine image (we taste like salt but we deny that we are salt). What purpose does this denial serve? The denial allows the creation of our ego/separate self. Our ego/separate self – ironically – is readily accepted by the Divine, but not in the way that we might think. The Divine knows that our ego/separate self is limited and finite and will offer us opportunities to fail. Failure can be our best teacher. God is good.

Parish Updates: During the Lenten season we will offer the Stations of the Cross each Monday evening at 6:30 in the church proper. We use reflections based on several of Pope Francis' teachings and documents. The Stations take about 30 minutes. We also offer (as we do during the Advent season) a daily meditation booklet.
