Some random thoughts

We are created in the image and likeness of God: as a blessing. While in the womb, we have everything that we need and we are happy. Once out of the womb however, we are dependent upon others to provide for our needs. Sometimes our needs are not met as quickly as we like and we let everyone know our displeasure. We are not acting badly. There can be no moral judgment. We are acting according to the human condition. It is a way of relating to the world that we instinctive learn: happiness is found in our feeling secure, and having everything we need, which includes the attention of others. When we learn this way of living, we forget where we received happiness before we began to demand it. Accepting this disordered image of ourselves leads us to disfigure the image that we have of God. God now becomes a judge who requires sacrifice and takes pleasure in condemning and torturing us for all eternity! Sadly, this way of living, makes us feel disgruntled ... like the Hebrews in our first reading from Exodus, who have been freed from slavery. They feel so disgruntled that they want to return to slavery! We do something similar each time we demand happiness from places and things that can only provide us with momentary happiness. We never grow beyond the infantile demands for security and attention. Jesus, in our Gospel story from John, invites us to relearn what God freely offers to us: eternal happiness in knowing that we are lovingly created by God. If we practice looking into the eyes of God, we will see a reflection that will take time for us to recognize: we will see ourselves emanating with beauty. Truly we will know and experience that we are created in God's image and likeness. We are a blessing and not a curse. Our lives can't help be transformed by this experience. God is good.

Parish Updates: After consideration, we have decided to not offer the cup. We continue to acknowledge that as adults you are capable of making good decisions. However, the symptoms of any virus do not manifest themselves immediately. So, one could have the flu/virus and not know it for a day or two. It is with this in mind that for the time being the cup will not be offered. Also, on the side of safety, the consecrated host will no longer be placed on the tongue where the saliva could be transmitted to the fingers of the one offering the host.
