Some random thoughts

The image portrayed by the understanding and comments of the church leaders in today's Gospel story from John is one of a vindictive and punishing God. The man who is blind is accused by the church leaders of displeasing God before he is born! Other church leaders offer an alternative: parents have displeased God, resulting in the man receiving the punishment of blindness. Jesus rejects out of hand any punishment being imposed by God. He – rather – says that God heals, and proceeds to heal the man of blindness. The Gospel writer uses this opportunity to use blindness in a different way. The author implies that those who are so enslaved by institutional religion are blinded by their judgments and condemnations of other people, and are also unable to see that they are resisting/rejecting the loving relationship that God is offering to them. When we are convinced that we see however. nothing can help us experience the very real blindness that prevents us from seeing. God is good.
