Some random thoughts

A human trait that we all share is our desire to know. It gives us comfort and a sense of control. It brings us clarity and ensures correctness. It also limits our view and eliminates union. The doctrine concerning the Trinity is one of those theological doctrines that has caused us a great deal of difficulty, in particular, since the 4th century. Before the difficulty began, followers of Christ accepted that the way in which God is known, is by the way in which God relates with us through Christ and by the Spirit who dwells within us. This, the early disciples accept is who God is: God is for us; God is union with God and with creation. Attempting to be more precise and eliminate thoughts about God that are deemed incorrect, the doctrine is reshaped. As it is, the primary way in which we know God (God being in union with us) is eliminated in favor of a more defined understanding (God relating within the Godhead). This results in a distance developing, and the influence that the Trinity has on our daily life disappears. No longer is God in union with us, now God is completely omnipotent. One characteristic of this image of God is that God cannot suffer. God creates us but is not in touch with us. God becomes a judge who rewards and punishes, seemingly arbitrarily. God is no longer love. The irony is that the central symbol of our religion (the cross) is God suffering. God is good.

Parish Updates: We have had to postpone both First Communion and Confirmation. Gina Vessella and Sue Vargas are communicating with families concerning possible dates for both Sacraments to happen. All priests of the Diocese have received permission to confirm those whose reception of the Sacrament was postponed this past April. We don't know – at present – what will be mandated come September/October concerning allowable numbers and social distancing, so we will need to be patient and flexible. We do know however, that these celebrations will take place.
