Some random thoughts by the pastor....

When we hear that we can only serve one master (in today's Gospel reading from Luke), we tend to narrow the meaning of this statement to money. Jesus however, rarely (if ever) spoke about money. Rather, his focus was on relationships and healing. Seen from this perspective, today's Gospel story is more about the way in which we lovingly and compassionately relate with other people than about the amount of cash that we have. Business relationships are both comparative and competitive. The focus is always on gaining an 'edge', and making the better deal. It is evident, for example, in the TV reality show The American Pickers that Mike and Frank are always attempting to negotiate a price that will permit them to make a profit. They form business relationships and network so that they can be well informed of the 'going price'. This is not a judgment or condemnation. Their business acumen is sometimes extraordinary. Jesus seems to be open to appreciating making a 'good' business deal. It isn't however, his main focus. Rather, he praises the steward for attempting to create relationships because he realizes that his personal resources are limited and soon will be nonexistent. God is good.
