Some random thoughts by the pastor....

The prophet Amos and the story that Jesus tells in today's Gospel story from Luke seem to focus upon individuals, but in reality focus upon a system that rewards those who are (in business or religion) successful and punish those who are (in business or religion) not successful. They undercut the approach that permits us to project onto other people our anger that they have succeeded at getting what we want, and highlight that what those who have succeeded did get isn't lasting. It evaporates and leaves us feeling parched. Both called this system an addiction: it never satisfies, and demands more and more. This leads to the lifestyle that Amos calls a fatal disease, and Jesus — in his story — tells us leads to our being so caught up in our addiction that we can't see anyone or anything else. We are consumed by the demand to be fed more and more. An addiction cannot be healed. It creates a gap that cannot be crossed. Healing can only come from our first recognizing that we are addicted. Most agree that such a recognition can happen only when we 'hit bottom'. That is, when we painfully experience that our resources are depleted. God is good.
