Some random thoughts by the pastor....

As happens with nearly everything, our Gospel story from
Luke has, through the years, been interpreted from a
perspective that we can bother God enough so God gives
us what we want. Another perspective however, allows
us to see that the Gospel writer is saying that God gives to
us freely and generously without our asking. We are
prevented from receiving because we are so busy thinking
that we have to pester God to get what we want. We
equate God with the judge who respects no one, rather
seeing and accepting God as Love. God is good.

Parish Updates: A few parishioners have expressed a
concern that CTK grounds are receiving more attention
than the church worship space. It is always a balancing
act. You have been most generous contributing to the
Maintenance Fund that numerous projects have been
undertaken over the past nine years. Many of these
projects have involved the church building (including the
church worship space). Most of the projects however,
are not readily visible. We have (to name a few):
replaced the two flat roofs (we had water leaking into the
building); replaced the heating system (the old boiler was
50+ years old and very inefficient); upgraded the electrical
supply; replaced all of the exterior doors of the church
building; replaced all of the lighting in the church worship
space; made space for those who are less mobile so that
they can worship and receive Communion more
comfortably; upgraded the sound system; installed heat
exchangers (for A/C); fixed a crack that had developed in
the building caused by settling; and replaced the flooring
in the church hall. Most of the exterior work on CTK
grounds is safety related. Some of these projects have
been: removing dead trees (many – if not all - threatened
endangerment of either people or property); removing
overgrown areas that included poison ivy (the area
between the parking lot and the playground in particular
had to be treated several times each year to ensure that
the youngsters of Joyful Noise – who leases the former
school building – and use the playground are kept safe
from poison ivy); creating a berm to prevent traffic from
passing through the parking lot and to discourage people
from parking in the lot and then walking to the mill
complex (this also encouraged the moving of all of the
car/truck wrecks that were parked in the driveway); and
clearing the tangle of trees and vines that overtook the
area behind the church building (the planting of
arborvitae was to help prevent the return of the weeds
and to eventually somewhat hide the junkyard. The
church worship space is a project that will soon be
undertaken. Several factors have to be considered
carefully: disruption of services; costs; and an
investigation into what is possible without the complete
closure of the church worship space for a long period of
time. It is with gratitude for your generosity that these
(and other projects like them) have been completed, and
that other projects (in the future) will be completed. As I
mentioned at the beginning ... it is a balancing act. Safety,
however, is the first priority.
