Some random thoughts by the pastor....

The actions of Jesus in today's Gospel story from Luke are as provocative as when he cured people in a synagogue on the Sabbath and told people that their sins were forgiven. His actions (including his actions toward Zacchaeus) plainly stated that God is not concerned about our sinful/sinless status. That is the concern of our fragile selves that unduly influences religion, culture, and society. Jesus says that God only sees the self that God creates. It is a dignity that nothing and no one can take from us because God can always see this dignity. Unfortunately, when religion, culture, and society is the only air that we breathe, we miss and dismiss this God-given dignity in favor of what we want. When we hear words like the greatest and the best, we are hearing the fragile self who always needs to be better than everyone else. This point of view (be it in religion, society, or politics) always uses violence as its preferred way of acting. When we are open to see the inherent dignity of people and creation in general, we follow a nonviolent way of life. God is good.
