### Some random thoughts by the pastor....

Our religion and the images that we have of God and Christ are influenced (sometimes unduly and often unawares) by our culture and what is happening in the world in which we live. The image of Christ as king develops during a time in which the hierarchy was pushing for the Roman church to be recognized as both the spiritual and political (temporal) leader of the world. The trappings that come with this effort are unfortunate (at best) and absent of God's love (at worse). The world was moving into the age of individualism and community was being pushed aside. The human mind was thought to be better than everything, and the more intelligent the person, the better they were thought to be. (All of which is self-referential and idolatrous, and therefore passing away.) This led to the belief that the earth and people with less (Western) education were beneath more (Western) educated people, and could be used for the betterment of the more educated. Community prevents abuse because people relate as equals who are graced with the image and dignity of God. Individualism promotes abuse because people compare and compete, and those more successful become so by degrading and using/abusing others and creation. The image of Christ the King initially grows out of this atmosphere. Our Gospel story from Luke reveals Jesus (the Christ) however, as one who lives community. That is, he is not self-referential and therefore passing away, but guided by love and therefore eternal. God is good.
