Some random thoughts by the pastor....

The reading this weekend from Isaiah and the Gospel reading from Matthew anticipate what is about to happen and offer space for what is to happen to take whatever shape that it chooses. We aren't always comfortable with this arrangement. We want God (or God's representatives) to control history and our individual lives. Naturally, we also rebel against being controlled. Saint Paul speaks of this way of life (when we want to be controlled and - at the same time rebel against being controlled) as 'living under the Law'. Jesus – in the Gospels – instructs his disciples that John the Baptist offers important teachings, but he also says - that his teachings are finite and therefore limited. The Baptist is 'living under the Law.' The power to transform us isn't found in this way of life. It fails to see and accept that the human and the Divine coexist. There is no separation. Why? Because love connects the human and the Divine. Love is a gift that supersedes 'living under the Law.' God is good.
