


Faith Formation

Some random thoughts

The Scriptures allow sneak images of God into the written word that contradict a primary image. One such image is that God forgives by breaking God's own rules. Such an image is difficult - if not impossible – for many people to accept. Living in our small and limited world, we feel threatened when rules are broken. Our expectations go unmet and we feel frustrated and disappointed. God – we say without saying it - must be consistently in agreement with our expectations. When God forgives without regard for a person's worthiness, purity, or acceptability, God is messing with the way that we want them to be, and we cannot allow this (for example. refusing happen people Communion). Jesus accepts the forgiveness that John offers. He accepts the possibility that God's forgiveness is as available as the water in the Jordan River. Then, he takes forgiveness a step further. He moves into a forgiveness that breaks the established, guarded, and required rules of his religion. John the Baptist widens these rules by offering forgiveness without the mandatory rites and rituals of his religion, but he can go no further. His limited view continues to bind him. Jesus offers us a baptism that transforms the way that we live and see, embracing infinity. God is good.
