Some random thoughts

As the Spirit pushed Jesus into the desert, now the Spirit pushes him to share his experience. message is so strikingly different from the teachings of the Jewish church authorities and the message offered by John the Baptist, that it causes a stir. He is not following the 'party line'. Jesus mingles with sinners, women, those with diseases, outcasts and the poor. He heals indiscriminately, mandates no criteria or expectations, and places no restrictions on who he accepts. The only people with whom he is critical are the religious leaders who refuse to listen. They cannot hear, he says, because they are too full of themselves - egoism. He does not condemn anyone ... including the religious authorities. He simply says that it is impossible for a rich person (someone filled with themselves) to have their lives influenced and transformed by God. God is good.
