




A convenient, consistent way to help our church grow

Some random thoughts

We don't know for sure when Jesus separated from John the Baptist. The Gospels – I suspect – hint at the separation when they tell us that, after John baptizes him, the Spirit urged Jesus to retreat to the desert. Soon after, Herod arrests John. Jesus embraces the shift in direction. The directional shift however, is more than assuming leadership. Jesus' message – though inclusive of John's message – eclipses the moral teaching and baptism of John. We taste this difference in Jesus' opening statement. John proclaims that God will (sometime in the future) judge us. Jesus announces that God (who is mercy, compassion, and nonjudgmental) is with us now! God is good.
