Some random thoughts

The healing that takes place in today's Gospel story from Mark is so indiscriminate that when it catches the attention of the religious leaders, they soon denounce it. Jesus begins healing and preaching in the Galilean town of Capernaum. The purists of the Jewish Religion and those who live in Jerusalem and its environs view the towns and villages of Galilee as uneducated and uncouth. The population is mostly illiterate and survive day to day. Galilee – and in particular Capernaum – is a trade center in which Jews mingled with Gentiles. Some who study the Scriptures suggest that Jesus starts in this backwater town to escape notice by the religious leaders. Others suggest that this area attracts Jesus because of the poverty of those living here. Whatever the reason the message that Jesus offers is clear: God indiscriminately loves us. The affect is dramatic. Those considered beneath the literate, (who keep the 600+ commandments, and who are socially acceptable because of wealth or prestige), are open to receive healing and a God who indiscriminately loves. Those who consider themselves as above the peasants and merchants of Capernaum prevent themselves from seeing and receiving God's gift. They reject the messenger and the message. He comes from Nazareth and not their equal. What prevents us from hearing and accepting the message that God loves indiscriminately? God is good.

Parish Updates: The Catholic Charity Appeal will take place in the first part of the Lenten Season. Please note: Due to the pandemic, Ash Wednesday (which falls on February 17th), will be different. We will remind everyone to 'Turn away from sin and believe in the Gospel.' but we will not be placing ashes on individual foreheads. We will offer however two Masses: 9:00 am and 6:00 pm, to invite all into the Lenten season.
