Some random thoughts

Today's first reading from Genesis is difficult. Historically, we know that sacrificing the firstborn child to appease the divine was a standard practice of the tribes living in the Fertile Crescent. We also know that people gradually evolved and the practice changed from the sacrificing of the firstborn child to animal and plant sacrifices. Our first reading speaks to this evolution. The understanding/perspective that the divine needs sacrifice, however, remains to this day. It is an unfortunate perspective. undercuts lt experience of the divine as loving and relational. Sacrifice is part of many people's lives, but as Jesus repeatedly points out, God doesn't demand sacrifice. Nor is our relationship with God contingent on Jesus being sacrificed. Rather, Jesus shows us God's indiscriminant love already existing within us. He instructs us that we need to find ways to awake and experience the indiscriminate love that is God. God is good.
