Some random thoughts

The forming of an identity is important for the Israelites. What makes their identity unique among the Semite people – of which they are apart – is the relationship that God has with them. The shortcoming that the Israelites have – as expressed in both the reading from Exodus and the Gospel reading from John - is their belief and understanding that God's relationship with them is exclusive. This leads to beliefs and laws and away from a relationship with a person. The early seeds of this transition is the codifying God's relationship The concrete laws/commandments with Israel. provide the Israelites walls that eliminate relationships with God and with other people. The focus becomes - for Israel - 'our exclusive salvation'; and for the today's thinking, 'my exclusive salvation'. Jesus is, in today's Gospel reading, frustrated and angry. All of his efforts to break through the barrier/wall that his Jewish Religion creates are having little effect. Both the Ten Commandments and Temple worship have their good side. They also isolate and insulate ... two characteristics foreign to God. God is good.

Parish Updates: Due to the pandemic, the Mass on Holy Thursday, the Service on Good Friday and the Easter Vigil will be different. We will not 'wash feet' on Holy Thursday, and the procession of the consecrated host will be abbreviated. There will be no kissing or touching the crucifix on Good Friday. Instead, the crucifix will be held aloft for a time during which veneration can take place from a distance. Finally, the singing of the Exultet (during the Easter Vigil) will be done from the choir loft rather than the lectern.
