## Some random thoughts ....

We live in a spiral in which order, disorder, and reorder play out repeatedly. Order leads to complacency and stagnation. The lack of movement generates disorder and chaos. The movement caused by disorder coalesces into reorder. Many of these natural cycles happen without our conscious awareness. Training a child to use a toilet is a good example. Relieving oneself is natural for a child (order). Training to wait and relieve oneself in a particular place feels unnatural (disorder). Learning a new way of relieving oneself gradually feels normal and order returns. The Scriptures offer us numerous examples of this process. Our first reading from Second Chronicles reveals the Israelites in a disordered state. They have been for a time in an orderly state and they protect the status quo. This leads to stagnation and abuse. The prophet Jeremiah recognizes the need to enter disorder so that a restart can happen. Disorder is most often uncomfortable and sometimes painful. We tend to The spiral in which order, disorder, and reorder play out repeatedly is the way that God creates the universe. We are a part of God's creation and follow the same cycle. God is good.

**Parish Updates:** Due to the pandemic, the Mass on Holy Thursday, the Service on Good Friday and the Easter Vigil will be different. We will not 'wash feet' on Holy Thursday, and the procession of the consecrated host will be abbreviated. There will be no kissing or touching the crucifix on Good Friday. Instead, the crucifix will be held aloft for a time during which veneration can take place from a distance. Finally, the singing of the Exultet (during the Easter Vigil) will be done from the choir loft rather than the lectern.
