Some random thoughts ...

In our first reading this weekend, Moses meets a God who is very different from Pharaoh (the god of Egypt). Pharaoh enslaves people for financial gain. He enlists the help of Joseph, a Hebrew, to create a system whereby the subsistence workers must surrender the food that they grow to Pharaoh who stores it in silos. The excuse used is fear of famine. Once the system is in place, the food is then sold (for a profit) to people with little or no money to pay for it. Once the money runs out, Pharaoh enslaves the people who must work in order to eat. Slavery is always about power, dominance and economic gain. Yahweh is free and sets people free. The primary difference is that Yahweh leaves no one behind. All are included. When Pharaoh wants only a few to worship Yahweh, Moses refuses. When Pharaoh wants all livestock to remain, Moses refuses. When Pharaoh wants children to remain, Moses refuses. He insists all must be included. Yahweh's freedom is always all-inclusive. The Exodus is the precursor of Eucharist ... all are welcome; all are included. God is good.
