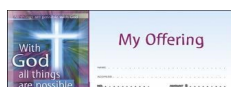

Some random thoughts

We tend to resist moving from order. (Institutions tend to resist more adamantly.) Slipping from order into disorder, however, is the way that God creates the universe and us. 'Unless the grain of wheat falls to the earth and dies,' John's Gospel tells us, 'it will never produce fruit.' Order promotes our need to protect what we think we have. The prophet, Jeremiah, confronts the Jewish hierarchy/institution who is protecting the status quo. They are not acting maliciously by protecting the status quo. They are acting in the ignorance and blindness that develops when we resist leaving order. We need people who can help us to see that our resistance causes us to suffer, and does harm to the people around us. Our efforts to protect the status quo can forestall our slipping into disorder for a time, but not indefinitely. Creation – by God's design – follows the cycle of order, disorder, and reorder. Why? Only God knows. The human experience reveals, however, that somehow love is the reason. Love never stagnates. Stagnant love is not love. God is good.

Parish Updates: More and more people are now receiving the COVID-19 vaccine. We are grateful. Most likely, the wearing of masks (that cover our nose and mouth) will continue, but permission – in the near future – to be closer together will allow us to remove some of the seating restrictions. When that happens, returning the hymnals to the benches will (I suspect) soon follow. It feels like a long time since singing together has been absent. This also means that a greater number of parishioners can worship together as a parish community. I look forward to this day. We wait with the patience of a child for Christmas to arrive!
