Some random thoughts ...

Jesus offers an understanding of God that is so greatly different from the understanding that the church leaders, the Jewish Religion, and most of the people have, that they cannot adjust. The same holds true today. The only way that we can understand God as Jesus understands God is by our experiencing God as Jesus experiences God...we must be open to receive love. To be open to receive love we must also be vulnerable. It is only when the younger son finds himself starving that life makes him aware that he is vulnerable. At that moment, he thinks of his father. Gradually, he opens to the possibility that his father loves him and that his father dwells with him and has never stopped dwelling with him. The elder son remains closed. He has everything (including love) that the younger son has but because he is closed, he is not vulnerable. He seeks rewards and not love. God is good.

Parish Updates ...

The COVID pandemic has changed the 'landscape' of CTK. About 33% (1/3) of parishioners who participated in Eucharist weekly/frequently are missing. Each year – being an older community – we experience a decline in numbers as parishioners migrate to Florida and other warmer climates. This is different. I understand that some continue to be fearful concerning the pandemic. My concern is that people will become so dependent upon Mass on TV or 'live streaming' that the communal celebration – people interacting with people – will disappear. We need human contact. It is our path to God!
