## Some random thoughts ....

It is easy for us to dismiss another person's thoughts, ideas, and perspectives. Some also berate other people because they don't share the same thoughts, ideas, and perspectives as us. We can easily feel annoyed by them. The annoyance that we feel can soon lead us to think and believe that the other person isn't needed. We have enough people who share the same thoughts, ideas, and perspectives with us. The slope then becomes slippery. If the other person isn't needed they can also be ignored or – if they are very annoying – can be eliminated. We enter the week that reminds us how easy it is to eliminate a person who disagrees and offers different thoughts, ideas, and perspective than the thoughts, ideas, and perspectives held by people in religious and civic authority. Jesus urges an image of God who is open and indiscriminately loving. The image held by religious leaders is one of a God who is closed and judgmental. We live the image of God that we have. God is good.

**Parish Updates:** More and more people are now receiving the COVID-19 vaccine. We are grateful. Most likely, the wearing of masks (that cover our nose and mouth) will continue, but permission - in the near future – to be closer together will allow us to remove some of the seating restrictions. This also means that a greater number of parishioners can worship together as a parish community. I look forward to this day. We wait with the patience of a child for Christmas to arrive!
