Some random thoughts ...

The Paschal Mystery (the birth, death, and resurrection of Jesus) is often misunderstood or interpreted from a human point-of-view. It seems that each time we interpret something from our point-of-view we do so from a 'closed' system. Fear prevents us from remaining open. Everything including God – becomes small in order to fit into our closed universe. Exclusion, expectations, requirements, membership, uniformity ensure that those included – except for a few – are very limited. This also serves as means to blame others who we exclude. The Paschal Mystery is openly inclusive of everyone! There are no exclusions, expectations, requirements, memberships, uniformity. indiscriminately scatters seed with no care that only a small percentage of the seed will grow and produce fruit. God pines for us, goes in search of us, rejoices with us when we are found, inviting all to rejoice as well, and pleads with those who refuse to rejoice. The Paschal Mystery originates in God. We do not cause it. We do not live moral lives in order to receive God's love. (That is not love. That is payment.) No, we first experience God loving us. which transforms the way in which we live. We become the eyes, and hands, and feet of God by which God can find ways to remove the fear from others so that they too can openly receive. God is good.
