## Some random thoughts ...

Revolutions are scary and necessary. Benjamin Franklin resisted any talk of revolution until the English politic leaders and king fired him from his politically appointed position as assistant postmaster. At the encouragement of his son, he left England and because he saw no other option, supported the talk of a revolution. Pope John XXIII invited theologians. who his predecessors and the Roman Curia silenced because their openness to change, to join with him as he promoted a revolution in the Roman Church that we call The Second Vatican Council. Pope John opened the windows and the authorities 'in charge' resisted, closing the windows every chance they got. Our walk with God in a Church that does so many good things and resists change can be difficult. Openness does not come easy to an institution or some/many people. We see this scenario acted out in today's first reading. The author of the Acts of the Apostles attempts to smooth over the rift between St. Paul and the leaders of the Jewish-Christians living in Jerusalem (James, in particular). Historically, that rift never completely heals. When the Roman army destroys the City of Jerusalem, the Jewish-Christians fade into nonexistence. St. Paul's open system allows for adaptation. That is our way through history, revolution, static and stale thinking, revolution. God is continually evolving and is never static. God is good.

#### Parish Updates:

Some have been wondering about the weekend schedule of Masses come July. After much consideration and recognizing that time is a necessity between Masses, the schedule will be, 4:00pm on Saturday (in both St. Anthony & CTK), 8:00am (in Portuguese) at St. Anthony, 9:30am at CTK, and 11:00am at St. Anthony. Please note ... there will no longer be an 8:00am at CTK on Sunday. The 10:00am at CTK on Sunday will change to 9:30am.
