#### Some random thoughts ...

When Saint Paul coins the phrase, the body of Christ, he references a cosmic energy that unites everyone and everything. The cosmic energy teaches us on an experiential and relational level that we are united and gifted with an eternal identity and not an identity that we earn or receive as a reward sometime in the future. The cosmic energy tells us that we live in Christ NOW. Jesus speaks of our living in the kingdom or reign of God NOW. Both have the same meaning, and both open us to a future of infinite possibilities. We – unfortunately – through the years have reduced Saint Paul's phrase, the body of Christ, to mean – solely – the consecrated host and wine... both of which are separate from us. We separate ourselves further by overemphasizing adoration. (There is nothing wrong with adoration as a form of prayer. When adoration takes on a greater importance than it is, it promotes separation instead of union.) The image of the body of Christ that Saint Paul promotes is that of a preexisting intimate relationship that God shares with us and we share with each other NOW. God is good.

**Parish Updates:** A story or two from when I first arrived at CTK... Jeanne Carrier, Roland Roy (Parish Trustees) and I met on the second floor of the Parish Center one evening before I officially became pastor. We discussed many topics. Both Jeanne and Roland were long time parishioners and freely offered insights into the workings of the CTK. They also freely offered their support and encouragement. They were the first of many blessings I would experience in CTK. As is my way, I process a bunch of small events and then apply what I have processed to a larger picture. Unfortunately, because I process within my head (rather than verbally), I often voice what I have been processing as immediate needs to be met rather than an ongoing working toward. This led some staff members to feel overwhelmed immediately and ready to quit a week after I arrived. Thankfully, we were able to talk and we arrived at a better understanding.
