Another way of interpreting the story views Jesus being one with the wind. The story of Job echoes Our first reading from Job this interpretation. describes Job as coming to a place where he is one with his suffering. The disciples and Job fight against the wind and suffering. Their conditions intensify rather than lessening. When Jesus accepts the wind and Job accepts suffering, they enter the eve of the storm, and calm follows. God is good.
