Some random thoughts

The people coming out of the slavery of Egypt are used to being indebted to the oligarchy of Pharaoh. Receiving freely, without expectation of repayment – debt – is new to them, and they have trouble adjusting. Further, they have difficulty with receiving enough for the day and not have something in reserve. The Egyptian system was like most oligarchies who control food and water (and other necessities) to cause debt. The Pharaoh, for example, extracts grain from people, who sustain themselves by what they produce, and stores it in silos. Next, the Egyptian system makes the poor purchase the grain, the Pharaoh extracted, making the people poorer and finally completely dependent. The people are no longer free. They are slaves. Once in the desert, the previous system stops working. Now, God provides for their needs by inviting them into a covenant of neighbors, in which there is no debt. Jesus reveals to his disciples that he agrees with the covenant of neighbors. He teaches them to pray, 'Forgive us our debt as we forgive the debt of others.' God is good.
