Some random thoughts

It isn't easy to remain open when we are insulted. The door that protects us is always ready to slam shut. Like the discrimination that continues today, many Jews (then and now) thought themselves better than the other Semites living in Palestine. They were/are the chosen people of God. Roman Catholics copied the mistaken identity of superiority promoted by some Jews. The only difference is that the Jews only briefly had superior military power to dominate other peoples. Roman Catholics – being aligned with the Roman government and culture utilized the military might at their disposal for several hundred years. Jesus - being human - is influenced by the Jewish prejudice. His initial reaction to the Canaanite woman comes from this bias. remaining open, however, catches his attention, and he recognizes his prejudice. Her openness helps Jesus to open and healing happens. God is good.

Parish Updates: Grandma's Attic is unfortunately closed indefinitely. The shift-supervisors met on August 4th and the decision was made that for the safety of volunteers and patrons – which are our first concern – the store would remain closed. The shift-supervisors will meet again in January (2021) to reassess the level of safety. This means regrettably, that nothing can be donated to Grandma's Attic; and since we do not know when the store will reopen, we strongly encourage any donations targeted for GA be donated elsewhere.
