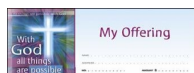

Each have an outreach to the poor. Our sense of Church and the way in which we celebrate Eucharist are also similar. Community is important to each parish. The details of this combining will take some time to work out. We will seek and appreciate the input of parishioners. Compromises will be a part of this process. Fr. Victor Silva and I will soon meet with Fr. Tim Reilly to discuss the combining from a Canon Law perspective. As always, I am open to listening to you.
