Some random thoughts

The irony of today's Gospel story is, God is ALWAYS open. We humans open and close, and maybe that is the meaning behind or Gospel story. Peter is singled out in the story as having authority to open and close. A possible the reference is to his impending choice to close when Jesus is arrested and crucified. It is only when he experiences the devastating effect that closing has on himself and others, and experiences forgiveness and mercy/love, that Peter experiences the power of the Holy Spirit (dwelling within him) to open. There are those who assign authority (to Peter) to save or condemn to these words in the Gospel story. It is an authority that separates Peter (and his successors) as sacred (set apart). Maybe it feels easier for us seeing Peter this way, so we don't have to deal with our own shortcomings. Unfortunately, when we don't experience and live with our imperfections (our sin), we can't experience mercy and love first hand. Secondary mercy and love is okay, but it is almost always conditional. It is only when we experience mercy and love first hand that transformation occurs. The Spirit, who always abides in us, is experienced. God is good.

Parish Updates: (Tidbits of information) – Those coming to weekend Masses reached about 50% toward the end of July and has pretty much remained steady. CTK continues to be financially sound as the generosity of parishioners always astounds me. Some parishioners have asked if I would be ending my term as pastor of CTK next year. (I am eligible to enter 'senior-status' next June, 2021.) That decision will not be made until sometime in January (2021). Once it is, a general announcement will be made to the parish.
