Some random thoughts

When we are babies, we learn by mimicking the people around us. This way of learning continues throughout our lives and we compliment this learning with data that we store in our brains. Mimicking unconsciously teaches us to express ourselves in a similar way as the one we mimic. We mimic hand gestures, facial expressions, body posture, the use of particular words, and multiple other things. Collecting data also influences how we view the world. When Jesus asks his disciples, whom they say that he is both mimicking and collected data influence the answer that Peter gives. The next paragraph reveals that mimicking and data are limited and do not take us far enough. They are good, and they are limited. Neither mimicking nor data bring about transformation. Great suffering and great love are necessary transformation to happen. When we settle for mimicking and data we become stuck in our limited view, and fail to see the bigger picture. We accuse, divide, judge and compare. This is what Peter does in today's Gospel story from Mark. Transformation takes time and we make mistakes. Jesus accepts and loves Peter (and the disciples). He will continue to accept and love Peter and all of his disciples when they in their fear, run away and leave him alone to face condemnation and death. It is the great love that Jesus offers (to his disciples), and the great suffering they experience (once they face what they have done) that transforms them. Their eyes are open to see the Risen Christ. God is good.

Parish Updates: Care and concern for each other will continue to dictate what we do and what we ask. We made the difficult choice to cancel the Parish Bazaar, with the multitude of opportunities for people to mingle and come together as a community, out of concern that the event would not be safe. We might have to ask – in the near future - that you wear a mask to Mass once again. It is our hope that we will not have to make such a request, but we wanted to give you a 'heads up' to the possibility.
