Some random thoughts

Many of us relate with ourselves, other people, and the world – to some degree – from a consumer's mind. My parents and the church, for example, passed on to me a mentality that God created everything for my use. I was much older when recycling and conservation developed. (One of my chores when I was young was to burn the trash.) Along with this initial mentality comes an elitist mentality. Creation serves my needs and wants. Unconsciously, this mentality carries over to other people who – we think - also serve my needs and wants. Competition and comparison follow. The more that we can consume the higher we are in the pyramid (or food chain). For thousands of years (and continues today) a hierarchical system influences (sometimes unduly) the decisions that we make, the people that we elect and the religion that we follow. Jesus rejects this way of life and offers a different way of life. He begins with knowing that God holds us, specifically, in a loving embrace. Once experienced and accepted, we stop competing and comparing (to some degree). This, in turn, opens our eyes to see that God uniquely holds all of creation – specifically – in a loving embrace. God is a mirror that reflects to us who we truly are as God creates us. God is good.

Parish Updates: Pope Francis delivered a call to action for the world: Get vaccinated. "Being vaccinated is an act of love," he said in a public service announcement released Wednesday. "To ensure the majority of people are vaccinated is an act of love." The pontiff and six other church officials from North, Central and South America called getting inoculated a moral obligation. "Thanks to God and to the work of many, we now have vaccines to protect us from Covid-19," Francis said. "They grant us the hope of ending the pandemic, but only if they are available to all and if we work together." He continued: "Vaccination is a simple but profound way of promoting the common good and caring for each other, especially the most I pray to God that everyone may contribute their own small grain of sand, their own small gesture of love; no matter how small, love is always great. Contribute with these small gestures for a better future." The Vatican in December declared that taking the vaccine was "morally acceptable." Both Francis, and his predecessor, Pope Benedict, have been vaccinated against Covid-19.
