Some random thoughts

Many of us have difficulty accepting that God creates us as an image of God. St. Paul uses terms like, 'You are God's work of art.' 'You are God's temple.' 'You are the aroma of God.' 'You are saints.' Our difficulty often is the result that we accept a way of seeing ourselves that is only partially true. We do create an identity based on the influences of our parents, family, religion and society that is small and limited. This small and limited self focuses on competition and comparison, perfection and imperfection. We base the way that we see ourselves (positively or negatively) on our successes or failures. This is not God's creation. It is our creation, and this creation is so small and fragile that we are always afraid. A consequence of our fear is division. We accept some as 'in' our group, and others as 'out' of our group. Those 'in' our group are good. Those 'out' of our group are bad. (See our first reading from Numbers, and our Gospel story from Mark.) Jesus accepts all. Jesus recognizes that God creates and dwells with everyone. Practicing to accept/experience this Good News opens us to participate in infinity. Our focus stops being on what we do and begins being in what we participate. Our shortcomings and our successes no longer dictate how we feel or see ourselves. As we are loved, we love others. God is good.

Parish Updates: Pope Francis delivered a call to action for the world: Get vaccinated. "Being vaccinated is an act of love," he said in a public service announcement released Wednesday. "To ensure the majority of people are vaccinated is an act of love." The pontiff and six other church officials from North, Central and South America called getting inoculated a moral obligation. "Thanks to God and to the work of many, we now have vaccines to protect us from Covid-19," Francis said. "They grant us the hope of ending the pandemic, but only if they are available to all and if we work together." He continued: "Vaccination is a simple but profound way of promoting the common good and caring for each other, especially the most I pray to God that everyone may vulnerable. contribute their own small grain of sand, their own small gesture of love; no matter how small, love is always great. Contribute with these small gestures for a better future." The Vatican in December declared that taking the vaccine was "morally acceptable." Both Francis, and his predecessor, Pope Benedict, have been vaccinated against Covid-19.
