Some random thoughts

The story of creation that we hear this weekend is different from the story of creation that we find in the first chapter of Genesis. In this story, a hierarchy exists, and males are on top. Males have dominion over the fishes of the sea, the birds of the air, and all that walk on the earth ... including females. The story of creation in the first chapter of Genesis simply says to all of creation, 'And God saw that it was good.' There is no hierarchy, and comparison and competition are not real. God sees all as good. That is what is real. Jesus, in our Gospel reading from Mark, then, focuses on the hierarchical mentality of the Pharisees. He says that there is an equality between female and male, just as there is an equality in all of creation, because God sees all that God creates as good. God is good.

Parish Updates: Pope Francis delivered a call to action for the world: Get vaccinated. "Being vaccinated is an act of love," he said in a public service announcement released Wednesday. "To ensure the majority of people are vaccinated is an act of love." The pontiff and six other church officials from North, Central and South America called getting inoculated a moral obligation. "Thanks to God and to the work of many, we now have vaccines to protect us from Covid-19," Francis said. "They grant us the hope of ending the pandemic, but only if they are available to all and if we work together." He continued: "Vaccination is a simple but profound way of promoting the common good and caring for each other, especially the most I pray to God that everyone may vulnerable. contribute their own small grain of sand, their own small gesture of love; no matter how small, love is always areat. Contribute with these small aestures for a better future." The Vatican in December declared that taking the vaccine was "morally acceptable." Both Francis, and his predecessor, Pope Benedict, have been vaccinated against Covid-19.
