



#### Some random thoughts ....

James Finley offers us an example that can help us understand both our first reading from Isaiah and our Gospel story from Matthew. *Imagine yourself,* he suggests, that you are standing in front of a full length mirror, and imagine the image of you (in the mirror) is conscious, that the image (in the mirror) can think. And this image of you (in the mirror) has been through a lot of therapy: the image has taken a lot of courses on being an insightful image. And (the image in the mirror) has come to a point in which (the image) informs you (the origin of the image) that you are no longer needed.

You say to the image of you (in the mirror), "Well, you know, this is going to be rough, really, since you are an image of me."

"'No," the image in the mirror says, "'I've worked on this; I've come to this point (where I can be separate from vou)."

'And so, to gently help the image out, you step halfway off the side of the mirror; and half of the image disappears. The image (in the mirror) has a panic attack and goes back into therapy and says to the therapist. "'I'm not real! I'm not real! I was working on my affirmations. I bolstered up my confidence, but I don't know where I went. I can see only half of me!""

This, the Scriptures tell us, is what God does for us. We are the image of God (the origin of our image) but sometimes we want to believe that we create our own image. When we do, God takes a step halfway off of the mirror. God never completely leaves, but in our panic we feel like we have been abandoned, and suffering happens to us. Simultaneously, love continues to be present. The gaze of God catches our eve, and we experience that we are loved. God is good.

**Parish Updates:** Our Trustees and Finance Committee have accepted last fiscal year's report. This is the report that we submit to the Diocese. The Parish report will be available the weekend of October 17-18. We did enter deficit spending as a result of the pandemic, but due to your generosity the deficit spending wasn't too great. We borrowed from CTK's Maintenance savings to offset the negative income (\$8,000), but we intend to gradually replace what was borrowed. More details will be available when the Parish report is published.
