


An email has been sent to all families previously in the program with a link to register for classes. If you did not

Some random thoughts

The desire for power is built into our fear for survival. In Darwinism, it is called 'survival of the fittest'. The desire for power has been balanced through the years with a desire to provide for those who have no power. The Book of Leviticus, Deuteronomy, the prophets, and Jesus, for example, admonish us to provide for those without power. Jesus goes further, instructing his disciples to identify with the powerless. balance, however, almost disappears when the dominant teaching of society and religion focuses on individualism. The Age of Enlightenment (in culture and in religion) emphasizes (almost exclusively) the individual. 'Jesus and ME' or individual salvation, and 'what is in it for me' or 'my rights' become our motivation in religion and culture. In Roman Catholicism, the sacraments outweigh everything else and clerics use this emphasis as their means of power over or dominance. A return to balance happens with the Second Vatican Council, but it is short-lived. The desire for power is too great without an ongoing and personal awareness that God loves ME uniquely, and the balancing awareness that God uniquely loves everyone and all of creation EQUALLY. From this perspective, community balances individual salvation and my rights. God is good.

COVID 19 and wearing of masks ... The safety of all who participate in our Eucharistic celebrations is a primary aim and concern. It is with this in mind that I suggest that everyone consider wearing a mask when participating in Mass (beginning November 6-7). This is not a mandate.
