ALWAYS BE HUMBLE AND KIND

Some random thoughts

Both our first reading from Ezekiel and our Gospel would have us ponder what it means to relate with people in light of the way that God relates with us. They invite us to wrestle with the question of immigration, deportation, unbridled capitalism, and many other way-of-life issues that we readily accept today. Our church has sided with the rich and powerful since Constantine (in 313 AD) declared Christianity to be the official religion of the state. The church went from being an underground and non-accepted church who met in catacombs, to an openly accepted religion who met in basilicas. Many recognized the dangers of this transition and sought detachment. They chose to live on the fringe of Christianity instead of accepting the attachments and expectations that came with fully participating. They recognized that full participation meant no criticism of the structure and institution. 'Buying into the system' came with benefits but at a cost. Those who chose to live on the fringe were free to live in community, which encouraged them to experience and reciprocate love. All were welcomed. They were better able to see beyond one issue, which prevented them from getting stuck and developing tunnel vision. They, like Pope Francis, were free not to judge another person's way of life, and to offer compassion without concern for social or moral status. We are invited, by today's Scripture readings, to wrestle with rather than simply accept (or ignore) practices that our institutional church and state readily accept. God is good.

Parish Updates: We encourage all to inform yourselves in as wide of a picture as you can (instead of focusing on one issue only), and vote in the upcoming election. It feels strange as we prepare to enter the month of November, not to be focusing on CTK's annual Bazaar. CTK's Christmas celebrations are also affected. So many factors are still unknown. Seating, for example, will be limited, especially at the Christmas Eve Mass (4:00). We are open to hear possible reasonable alternatives.
