**We are grateful to our parish community for all your support and prayers during this unprecedented time.** When we are unable to gather to worship together, electronic giving helps stabilize our parish finances. We currently have **27** families enrolled in the **Bill Pay Program** through their financial institutions. If you are already enrolled in the Bill Pay Program at your financial institution, the set up is a few quick steps! You select the frequency and dollar amount of the payment (donation). The bank will generate a check and mail it to us as instructed. It's that simple ... you no longer have to worry about having the right change or writing a check each week. We have a box on our budget envelopes marked "I Gave Electronically", check the box and place it into the collection basket. Your consistent support is very much appreciated.

### Some random thoughts ....

Saint Paul – in his letters – calls all who live in community, saints. Community unites separateness (sanctity). It is when we divide or eliminate community, that saints are fully separate. Hierarchy, purity codes, worthiness, and the emphasis on virginity follows. Today we celebrate the community of saints. The community of saints includes every person and all of creation. It is the celebration of God pouring forth love indiscriminately. The need for canonical saints develops as God's union with us diminishes. The more separate God is from us/creation the more we need intermediaries. When Christ is crowned king (13<sup>th</sup> century), all access to God is eliminated. (Much like all access to royalty is impossible.) An agent must be employed who will speak on our behalf. This approach is completely foreign to Jesus and Paul. Both experience and accept that God dwells with us, within us. Community is the outward expression of this reality. God is good.

**Parish Updates:** We encourage all to inform yourselves in as wide of a picture as you can (instead of focusing on one issue only), and vote in the upcoming election. It feels strange as we prepare to enter the month of November, not to be focusing on CTK's annual Bazaar. CTK's Christmas celebrations are also affected. So many factors are still unknown. Seating, for example, will be limited, especially at the Christmas Eve Mass (4:00). As a result, we will offer a second 4:00 Christmas Eve Mass in the church hall. Hopefully, this will allow all who want to celebrate Christmas can.
