#### Some random thoughts ....

In 313 CE things changed for Christianity. We moved from minority to majority. The Emperor, Constantine, declared (for several different reasons) Christianity as the official religion of the Roman State. One side effect of the change from minority to majority quickly revealed itself. Church stopped being a movement and became a monument. A movement enlivens. A monument urges us to remember what used to be but is no more. Once Christianity became a monument, the need to protect led to our pursuing dominance. Jesus lived and preached service and humility. He lived and preached nonviolence and inclusiveness. He lived and preached sharing and community. What he preached, and what he lived, then, is opposite to being a king. When the church declared Jesus the Christ king in the 13<sup>th</sup> Century, Christianity dominated Europe. The crusades against Muslims the church declared The church structure fossilized into a monumental hierarchy. Parishes were a means of income, and the greater the income the greater the power a person had. Many in the church forgot the common good that Jesus preaches and lives. Thankfully, the need for the common good never completely disappeared, and the social doctrine of the church encouraged service and humility. Pope John XXIII, for example, introduces the phrase 'universal common good' in 1963. We need monuments and we need movements. Monuments help us remember. Movements engage our active participation. God is good.
