

Some random thoughts

Saint Teresa of Avila once said that 'we cannot know God until we know ourselves.' Her words echo our Gospel reading from Mark where we hear Jesus imploring his disciples (and us) to be awake. We are all born into an atmosphere and an environment that affect us on an unconscious level. Our image of God, how we view our selves and others, how we view the world and the universe. Our unconscious develops a lens through which we see. This is neither good nor bad. It comes with being human. Jesus tells us 'watch'. When we watch, we might glimpse a portion of the lens that we use. The lens through which I saw God and the world, for example, included a thought that said, 'If something good happens, I can expect something bad to happen.' That thought/lens implanted an image of God, myself, and the world that flavored how I related with God, myself, and the world. Later, I perceived a larger thought that impressed upon me that life is a collection of rewards and punishments that God arbitrarily administers. When this lens was operating unconsciously, I could never be ready - open - to welcome God. I had (unconsciously) to distract myself. The purpose for prayer is to catch a glimpse of the lens that we use. When we glimpse our unconscious thoughts and patterns, we also have an opportunity to momentarily glimpse the back of God. It is enough for transformation to begin, and our unconscious lens to change and become more conscious. God is good.
