PASTORAL ADVISORY COMMITTEE  
MINUTES OF MEETING

January 28, 2026

The meeting was opened with a prayer by Father Morris. Those present were Mike Bosworth, Donna Bosworth, Candy Costa, Christine Shephard, Matt Silva, Andy Taylor, Rita Selby, Jim McLellan and Walter Richardson.

Rita Selby presented the report from Grandma's Attic for the period of January 1, 2025 to December 31, 2025. During that period 1467 people were served (including the day of the bazaar). Total revenue was \$13,124.30. Disbursements were as follows: Outreach \$5,955.25, Expenses \$1,212.84 and Christ the King \$5,956.20.

Candy Costa reported that the bazaar did well and that there were many donations. The May breakfast planning is in progress. The May Breakfast will be held on May 3, 2026 from 7:30 am to 11:00 am.

Jim McClellan advised the committee that the scouts and pack are overall doing well. The troop and pack will celebrate scout Sunday on February 8<sup>th</sup> and will assist with coffee 'an. Also the scouts will help with the fall bazaar.

Matt Silva reported that there will be another bingo on May 17<sup>th</sup>. There will be a digital board and gift cards will be solicited again.

Christine Shepard noted that that there are items in the working sacristy that need to be organized and some things need to be given to Grandma's Attic or some other group. Some items can be discarded. The Christmas trees will be stored upstairs which will enable the set up for Christmas to be easier.

Mike Bosworth advised the committee that Margie Fallow has volunteered to be a new lector for the Saturday 4 pm Mass. Mike noted that the timer for the light for the stained glass window at the front of the church is not working and should be replaced. Mike also inquired if the Bishop could be invited to a Mass and/or event such as the May Breakfast.

Matt Silva reported that there are 96 students in faith formation. Of those 14 are from Christ the King and 82 are from St Anthonys. Matt also brought up the concept of a mission for the church as it had been discussed at a recent staff meeting. There was considerable discussion on this topic with many valuable suggestions by committee members. This topic will continue to be worked on.

Father Brian noted that the parking lot will be sealed and striped this spring. Also he noted that the Diocese insurance representative had evaluated the parking lot and found it to be in acceptable shape. Father Brian announced that Debbie DeCesaris will be retiring as of April 30<sup>th</sup>. The church will be searching for someone to take over her position. The twenty five week club will begin with a letter to parishioners in May. The first drawing will be in July.

Christine Shephard inquired about the Holy Week schedule and in particular the Easter Vigil as Christ the King Church had not had an Easter Vigil since 2022. Father Brian responded that it would not be feasible to have the Easter Vigil at Christ the King Church this year but that he would give some thought to the Holy Week schedule.
